

Campervan Site Regulations

2018 National Ploughing Championships

- A campervan site will be located in close proximity to the trade arena – please follow directional signage. Campers found parked in any other car parks will be towed away.
- **Park At Your Own Risk** - the official NPA Campervan Site is for your convenience and you park at your own risk. The National Ploughing Association Ltd. assumes NO responsibility for personal injury, loss or damage to vehicles/campervans/caravans parked in the NPA official Campervan Site.
- NPA do not provide any campervan parking in the trade arena over night as the exhibition arena is in lock down for repair works during that time. NPA take no responsibility for the safety of persons failing to comply with this regulation.

Please note:

- A clear separation distance of 6 meters is to be kept between all campervans (all sides of the campervans). The Campervan/Caravan site parking spots will be marked out prior to your arrival. You must park in the designated spots as they have been marked out in accordance with Offaly Fire Services Rules and Regulations.
- If awnings are present or cars are parked beside caravan, the 6 metre separation begins from the edge of the awning/car.
- This site is for Campervan / Caravan parking only – pitching of Tents is not permitted.
- No portable petrol generators are to be used as they have a much higher fire risk, particularly when refuelling. An exception to this would be diesel generators fitted within the campervan, generators are not permitted in the campervan site.
- Only gas cylinders fitted within the campervan will be permitted. Cylinders should only be stored in the unit's gas locker; and must be 7kg or less. No portable LPG devices.
- A fire watch manned by security personnel will be maintained at all times on the campervan site during the hours of darkness, located so that they can view the whole site at all times.
- Patrols will be carried out to prevent unauthorised camp-fires, barbeques, petrol generators etc. Security will be equipped with a suitable supply of fire extinguishers and instructions to call the fire service at the earliest detection of any fire via 999.
- Patrons bringing campervans will be encouraged to ensure their campervan has a working fire extinguisher, fire blanket, smoke alarm and carbon monoxide alarm.
- All campervans must be in compliance with Irish National Safety Standards and must have certification available for inspection if requested.
- Please note campervan residents can only stay in the National Ploughing Association official Campervan site from Monday 17th September 2018 to Friday 21st September 2018.
- Deep fat fryers, barbeques, open fires and use of gas cylinders are NOT permitted.
